

"Feelings Charades: Expressing Emotions Through Play"

Game Guidelines for Teachers:

Objective:

The objective of "Feelings Charades" is to help students develop emotional intelligence and enhance their ability to recognize and express different emotions. By engaging in charades, students can have fun while learning to understand and communicate feelings effectively.

Materials Needed:

- Feelings list (provided below)
- Small pieces of paper or index cards
- A container to hold the feelings cards
- Open space for acting out charades

Game Guidelines:

- **Introduction to Emotional Intelligence:**

- **Preparing the Feelings Cards:**
